Please consider this letter and attachments as a formal petition pursuant to 40 CFR 70.8 (d) to object to Title V Air Quality Permits issued to Spectra Energy by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation for the expansion of the Southeast Compressor Station in Putnam County, New York and the Stony Point Compressor Station in Rockland County, New York as part of Spectra Energy's Algonquin Incremental Market (AIM) pipeline expansion project.

I am a North Salem resident living 3 miles from the Algonquin Southeast compressor station and already we are being gravely impacted by its emissions, particularly on overcast days - that causes the emissions to hug the ground - with winds blowing from the direction of the compressor station. I gave personal testimony before the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) and NYS Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC) that I have COPD and because Spectra refuses to give our town advance notification of planned blowdowns, I came close to death with a blowdown of only one of the five Southeast units in January 2014 when winds blew from the compressor station on an overcast day. Again in January and February 2015, I experienced an extreme exacerbation that landed me in the hospital and ensuing rehabilitation that was caused by normal peak load emissions with winds blowing from the compressor station on overcast days.

According to you, the US EPA, we are a Non Attainment Zone in Ozone and Particulate Matter. There've been at least a dozen Air Quality Alerts in the last 6 weeks which is a strong reminder that this region cannot afford significant increases in toxic emissions further degrading poor air quality and increasing risks to public health especially children, the elderly, those with cardiovascular and respiratory problems and other health compromised conditions.

Not only did NYSDEC fail to protect us before they issued AIM Air Title V Permits by first conducting 24 hour baseline air monitoring showing the true and honest levels of the compressor stations emissions instead of the technology manufacturers' projections and evaluating cumulative impacts from all sources of pollution in this region and health impacts, but now NYSDEC is trying to raise to an astronomical level the amount of blowdown emissions that would require reporting and notification. Unacceptable! Additionally, the unconscionable practice condoned by FERC for industry to use "air credits" must be abandoned in order to protect public health. Using

air credits allows industry to contaminate our air with hundreds of thousands of extra tons of dangerous pollutants beyond safe limits of what's fit for human and other species' consumption.

We are being poisoned to death by natural gas infrastructure buildout or forced to move from our homes to survive with no state agency honoring its mandate to protect the health and safety of its residents and environment. Hence, we count on you, US EPA, our last resource of protection. Please grant us justice and deny approval of the AIM Stony Point and Southeast Air Title V Permits until true and honest 24 hour monitoring is conducted of compressor station emissions, cumulative impacts have been evaluated in this Non-Attainment Area, and a Health Impact Assessment conducted that will prove the untenability of any increased compressor stations toxic emissions.

We beseech your support in protecting our health and lives.
