**MEMORANDUM**

**SUBJECT:** Reallotment of FY 2021 DWSRF Funds

This memorandum announces the availability of reallotted federal fiscal year (FY) 2021 Drinking Water State Revolving Fund (DWSRF) dollars. These funds originated from the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2021 (P.L. 116-260). Note that a Congressionally directed rescission could lower these amounts.

In April 2022, the State of Wyoming declined its \$11,001,000 FY 2021 allotment. By law, EPA must reallot unobligated funds after the second fiscal year of availability. This follows the process explained in our September 11, 2020, memorandum, "[State Revolving Fund Capitalization Grant Reallotment Procedure](#)."

As authorized by the Safe Drinking Water Act, EPA is reserving 10 percent of funds available for reallotment to provide additional assistance to tribes. The remaining funds are available to the 49 other states, Puerto Rico, and the District of Columbia. Attachments A and B list the state and tribal allotments, respectively.

Eligible entities have until September 30, 2023, to apply for and receive their portion of the reallotted funds. For the tribal funds, Regions must obligate the funds by that date. Any available funds remaining unawarded after that date will be included in the next year's reallotment calculation.

These reallotted funds carry all program requirements and authorities associated with the FY 2021 appropriation and all current statutory rules, (e.g., the 12 percent Disadvantaged Community additional subsidy floor, Build America Buy America (BABA) requirements). Regions and states should review the March 1, 2021, memorandum "[FY 2021 DWSRF Allotment Availability](#)" and its attachments to determine the appropriate terms and conditions. Attachment C shows the state-by-state mandatory Congressional and Disadvantaged Community additional subsidy amounts. Regions and states should note the higher Disadvantaged Community additional subsidy floor for these reallotted funds, in comparison the original floor for the FY 2021 appropriation.
