Re: Final 2017 Contingency Plan Threshold modifications

Dear Mr. Hornbrook:

With this letter, EPA Region 1 approves the two Contingency Plan Threshold modifications proposed in your November 13, 2017 to EPA and Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection. MWRA proposed the following changes:

- Delete the Contingency Plan Caution Level threshold for Phaeocystis; and
- Delete the upper range only thresholds currently tested for infaunal diversity.

These threshold modifications were discussed at the Outfall Monitoring Science Advisory Panel (OMSAP) meeting on October 27, 2016. Both the OMSAP and the Public Interest Advisory Committee to OMSAP supported these modifications. MWRA submitted these proposed changes to EPA and MassDEP as interim modifications on January 3, 2017. On February 3, 2017 EPA sent a letter to MWRA stating that we did not object to these interim changes.

This proposal was distributed via the EPA Region 1 electronic notification listserver for the Massachusetts Water Resources Authority (MWRA) Contingency Plan. The MWRA also published the proposed modification in the Environmental Monitor.

With this approval, these modifications will take place immediately. Please note that this approval is only for modifications to the Contingency Plan thresholds. MWRA will continue to monitor *Phaeocystis* and infaunal diversity as per the monitoring plan.
