Endangered Species Compliance

There is currently one federally endangered or threatened species found within the borders of the Town of Wrentham, MA. The species is the Northern Long-Eared Bat. It is currently listed as "Threatened." A copy of the determination by Fish and Wildlife is attached to this Notice of Intent. There are no critical habitats located within the Town of Walpole. Based on this information there are no negative impacts associated with the stormwater discharges or discharge activities that would affect this species.

National Historic Preservation Act Compliance

Stormwater discharges associated with the Town of Wrentham MS4 were previously authorized under the 2003 Massachusetts MS4 Permit. The discharges do not have the potential to cause effects on historic properties. Click to add text

The Town of Wrentham twice attempted to get an IDDE bylaw passed at Town Meeting and both attempts failed. The Town plans to revisit adoption of an IDDE regulatory bylaw and anticipates bringing this updated bylaw to a vote at Town Meeting in November, 2019.
