### Highlights

- Creates 2 full-time jobs and 41 temporary jobs
- Expands footprint and capacity of existing compost facility by 113,000 square feet and 20,000 tons, respectively
- Funds 10,063 curbside organics carts in Clearfield, Farmington, Sunset, and Syracuse

### Grant Funding: \$3,412,223

The Project will expand the aerated static pile compost facility adjacent to the Davis Landfill and fund curbside organics collection receptacles for the cities of Clearfield, Farmington, Syracuse, and Sunset. Additionally, the District will create a pilot project to detect contamination in curbside organics receptacles using cameras and artificial intelligence technologies. Finally, Wasatch will implement education and outreach activities to increase participation and reduce contamination.

### SWIFR Grants for Political Subdivisions

The Save Our Seas 2.0 Act provides investments in recycling to support the implementation of the National Recycling Strategy and build a circular economy for all. This funding supports improvements to waste management systems and programs, allowing for more efficient resource use and less environmental impact from waste materials. The SWIFR grant funding can be used to establish or optimize collection and management of materials; fund infrastructure, technology, or other improvements to reduce contamination; enhance markets for recycled commodities; and increase the diversion, recycling rate, and quality of materials collected for municipal solid waste.
